2021-2022 Superintendent Goals

<u>Goal 1:</u> By the end of the 2021-22 school year, the 4-year (on-time) SUSD graduation rate will increase 10% from 2019-20 data (from 70% to 80%) and meet or exceed the state average as measured by ODE summative data.

<u>Goal 2:</u> By the end of the 2021-22 school year, median mathematics scores for the "all students" group, as measured by Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC), will increase:

- K-5 Math Achievement: from 29.6% (18-19 data) to 35%
- K-5 Math Growth: from 44% (18-19 data) to 55% (level 4)
- 6-8 Math Achievement: from 24.3% (18-19 data) to 30%
- 6-8 Math Growth: from 57% (18-19 data) to 60%
- Grade 11 Math Achievement: from 21.4% (18-19 data) to 35%

<u>Goal 3:</u> By the end of the 2021-22 school year, median scores for the "students with disabilities" group, as measured by SBAC, will increase:

- Grade 11, ELA Achievement: from <5% (18-19 data) to 25%
- Grade 11, Math Achievement: from <5 (18-19 data) to 21%
- 9<sup>th</sup> Grade On Track: from 62.5% (18-19 data) to 90%
- 4-Year Graduation: from 60.5% (3-yr average) to 85%

<u>Goal 4:</u> By the end of the 2021-22 school year, median scores for the "economically disadvantaged" group, as measured by SBAC, will increase:

- 4-Year Graduation: from 75.5% (3-yr average) to 90%
- K-5 ELA Growth: from 52% (3-yr average) to 55% (level 4)
- K-5 Math Achievement: from 22.1% (3-yr average) to 32%
- 6-8 Math Achievement: from 17% (3-yr average) to 21%
